

Baltimore. In conformity with the statements and determinations made as aforesaid by the Board of State Canvassers, the Governor shall issue commissions to the different persons elected, as now provided by the Constitution and laws of this State, and in addition the Secretary of State shall likewise without delay transmit a copy under seal of his office of such certified determination and statement as to the election of a United States Senator to represent the State of Maryland in the Senate of the United States to the Secretary and presiding officer respectively of the United States Senate, to inform that body of the result of the election for Senator; and such certificate shall be prima facie evidence of the right of the candidate certified as receiving the highest number of votes to be seated.

CHAPTER 475.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 160-A of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Elections," sub-title Primary Elections, as repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 134 of the Acts of 1912, and to repeal Section 160-G 2 of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Elections," sub-title Primary Elections, as said Section 160-G 2 was enacted by Chapter 554 of the Acts of 1912.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 160-A of Article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Elections" sub-title "Primary Elections" as repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 134 of the Acts of 1912, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

SEC. 160-A. Political parties which at the general election held on November 2nd, 1909, in the State of Maryland, or which at any future general election next preceding any primary election to be held hereunder, as shall have polled ten per cent. of the entire vote cast in the State at such or any such general election, shall hereafter nominate all their candidates for public office in and for Baltimore City, and the several counties of the State and for Judges and for the House of Representatives of the Federal Congress, and shall elect all delegates to county, legislative district, Congressional, City and State conventions, and all members of managing bodies in said
