Resolved, That all proceedings against Benjamin G. Jones, formerly sheriff of Harford county, and his securities, on a two judgments against them at suits of the state of Maryland, be suspended until the twentieth day of January eighten bundred and thirty, Provided, the said Benjamin G. teach bundred and thirty, Provided, the said Benjamin G. the said benjamin day of March next, and the whole balance of the said judgments on or before the second day of March next, and the manufacture of the said judgments on or before the twentieth day of January eighteen hundred and thirty.

And it is further resolved, That the said Benjamin G. Jones be charged but six per centum interest on said judgments; Provided he shall make punctual payment according to the terms of the above resolution.

A Resolution in favour of John Goddard, of Prince-George's Panet Febrate county, who was a Soldier of the Revolutionary War.

Resolved. That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John Goddard, of Prince-George's county, or to hisorder, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

No. 30.

A Resolution in favour of John Curtis, of the City of Bal-Peers Peb 20,100 timore, who was a Soldier of the Revolutionary War.

Resolved. That the tressurer of the western shore, pay to John Curtis, of the city of Baltimore, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a matross in the artillery, in consideration of his services during the revolutionary war.
