W HERYAS, an act passed at last session of the Legislature, authorising the Register of the Land Office, for the Western Shore, to issue a patest to a certain John Morriso, Alias John Morrison, of Baltimore county, for a tract of land called Pleasant Hills, lying in said county, purchased by him from the intendant of the revenue; Provided, the said Morris should pay to the Treasurer of the Westers Shore, the sum of fifty cents per acre, for twenty-nine acres of surplus land included in the survey thereof, and whereas, the said treasurer has expressed some doubts, whether he would be justified in receiting said fifty cents per acre, without interest; and there appearing no account on the books of the said treasurer, against said Morris.
