Passed Managarass An act for the relief of Artemus W. Maynard, James Hartison and Gassaway Walkins.

Benefit of insolvent

Be it enveted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of his livent controls for the city an county of Baltimate, and the judges of Bartimore count court, res. ectively, be and they are bareby amborised and empowered to grant to Autonore, W. Maynard, James Harris and Gassaway Nathins, the bereilt of the several acts of Assembly passed for the relief of medivent debters, provided, that the said Artemus W. Maynard, James Harris, and Gassaway Wathins, shall in all respects except that of provit g residence comply with the requisitions of said acts of Assembly, and that they rather the band commissioners that they did not come into this State, with a view of obtaining the benefit of said insolvent laws aforesaid Provided, also that the said Artemus W. Maynard, James Harris, and Gassaway Watkins, shall be compelled to file their petitions for the benefit of said insolvent laws, previous to their discharge from custody.

CHAPTER 349.

Passed Manan, 1835 An act for the revaluation and reassessment of the Real Property of St. Mary's County.

Appoint assessert,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Levy court of Saint Mary's county shall on or before the first Monday of May next, appeint in each election district in said county, three discrett and suitable persons as commissioners residents of the districts, whose business it shall be to value and assess all the real property of Saint Mary's county, in their respective districts subject to taxation, a majority of whom shall be competent to act, and in the event of the death, removal, or disqualification of all or either of them, the levy court is hereby authorised and required to supply forthwith such vacancy or vacancies.
