have Asigned you and every of you jointly and severally our Justices to keep our peace within our County of
Somerset and to do equal Law and Right to all the things subjects Rich and Poor according to the laws
Customs and directions of the Refe Assembly of the Province as far forth as they provide and where they are
Silent according to the laws customes Statutes and Reasonable Customs of England as used and practised
within this Kingdome for the conservation of the peace and quiet Rule and Government of the things
Subjects within our said County and to chastise and Punish all or any Person or Persons offending against the
said Act Law Statute and Custom or any of them according to the directions thereon to call before you every
of you all those who in our County as shall shew to do any bodily harm to any of the things subjects or
burn their houses or otherwise break our peace and to have themselves to find sufficient security of the
peace and good behaviour to us and the said subjects and if they shall refuse to find such security then
you cause them to be committed into safe custody until they shall be delivered by a constable from these
Also we have Asigned you and every three or more of you a sufficient number of the said Subjects to
Charles Hammond, Samuel Chamberlain, Phillip Thomas, David Long, Richard Lee Benedict Calvert,
Robert Johnson, Henry Daniel Dulany Stephen Wardly, John Ridout, Jane Ward, Langdon Whalley, Joseph
Gillif, Iaphain Wilf, and Samuel Adams or any of you always to have and to keep to keep in ready
of your and all the men for County of Somerset the tenth of the month of November 1660 to bring
all the men of Somersett, Isle of Wight, Isle of Man, and the Islands of the British Nation to the place
of any Dwelling house or other place contiguous to and near with any dwelling house or any other place
wherin there shall be any person or any goods or Merchandise Slave Indian Corn or Shodder and all other
Criminal Offences done or perpetrated by any Negro or other Slave and all persons all Consulting advising and
conspiring of Negroes and other Slaves to Rob all or Steale any Goods or to Murder or to do any person
or to Rob any White Woman or to attempt to burn any Dwelling house or other place contiguous thereto
and therewith and all other Slaves to Rob all or Steale any Goods or to Murder or to do any person
the Manservants and Officers whatsoever of which persons from peace lawfully may be ought to begin
by whomsoever or howsoever in our County done or committed or which may hereafter happen to be done or
committed and also of all those who in our County in the Manner have gone or fled or shall hereafter
presume to go or ride with armed force against our Peace to the disturbance of the Kings Subjects and of all
such who in our County have Lain or shall hereafter presume to lie in wait to burn a dwelling of the
Kings Subjects and also of all Ordinary Leapers and other persons who have offend in hereafter shall

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
