

doth come herunto that County Court before William Trisby Esq^r and his associates his Lordships Justices of the Peace County Court to wit at Chester Town in the afo County the day of August Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty and for the same Lordship doth give the Court here to understand and be informed that William Bourkham late of St. Pauls parish in the County afo labourer the fourth day of July Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty at the parish afo in the County afo within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon Thomas Mauroy in the peace of God and the said Lordship then and there being with force and arms an assault did make and kill the said Thomas Mauroy and there did beat wound and cruelly beat so that of his life it was much endangered and other harms to him then and there did to the great damage of the said Thomas & against the peace of the same Lordship his good rule and government wherefore the afo attorney prayeth the advice of the Court here in the premises for the Lordship and due process of Law against the afo William in this part to give to answer to the Lordship stand upon the premises

And the afo William Bourkham in his proper person cometh here into Court and saith that he cannot gainsay the premises afo so as afo against him but nor but that he is guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by the afo Information it is alleged and thereupon submits to the Court.

Therefore it is **CONSIDERED** by the Justices here to wit at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third day of August being the eighteenth day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty That the afo William Bourkham pay the sum of two hundred pounds of Tobacco as a fine to the right Honourable the Lordship for committing of the assault afo as afo Confess and also pay the sum of two hundred forty two pounds of Tobacco Costs accruing on the premises afo to the officers of this Court

ORDERED by the Court here that Joseph Young Esq^r High Sheriff of said City keep the afo William Bourkham in safe custody until the fine and costs afo shall be satisfied

Whereas the afo William Bourkham on the fifth day of July last entered into recognizance before Mr John Evans one of his Lordships Justices of the Peace for the afo County for his appearance to this Court. The afo Thomas in his proper person here in Court appears and answers same ordered by this Court that the same be discharged. This Court here discharges the same recognizance bearing in the sum of ten pounds Sterl for the appearance of the afo William Bourkham and John True his Security at the same time in the sum of two pounds Sterl and is by this Court also discharged. No person showing an cause to the contrary. This Court ordered that the Clerk of the Indictments of the Sheriff Eschequer an Information against the afo William on the afo Act. which was done as above &c. — it was ordered also that the afo Sheriff
