Martin's Landing, and as the establishing the same a public road would greatly administer to the convenience of the public, they humbly prayed that the same XVIII. might be made a public road, and put upon the fame footing, and kept up under the same regulations, as other public roads are; all which appearing to this general affembly reasonable, therefore,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the road aforefaid, leading from Crooked Run to Saint-Martin's Landing, be and the same is Road declared hereby declared, deemed and taken to be, a public road for ever, and hereafter to public, &c. be kept up and repaired as other public roads are in faid county, any law to the contrary in anywife notwithstanding.

C H A P.

An ACT to increase the allowance to jurymen of the general court, and the several county courts, in this state. cember 28.

Allowance to jurymen of the general court.

Te it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the first day of February next there shall be allowed to each grand and petit juryman attending the general court on the western and eastern shores of this state, the sum of twelve shillings and six-pence current money for each and every day fuch grand and petit juryman shall attend for the discharge of his duty, besides itinerant charges.

II. And be it enacted, That from and after the commencement of this act the the treasurers, treasurers of the western and eastern shores, or either of them, shall and they are hereby authorised and directed to pay out of any unappropriated or surplus money which shall be in their respective treasuries, unto each juryman of the general court on the western and eastern shores, or his assigns, upon such juryman or his affigns producing a certificate from either of the clerks of faid court, such sum as may appear to be due upon the face of such certificate, and the said payments shall be made at the city of Annapolis, or the town of Easton.

III. And be it enacted, That the clerks of the said courts shall and they be made out, are hereby directed to make out such certificates, with the several sums so due expressed in words at length; and the said clerks shall return to the general assembly of Maryland, on or before the twentieth day of November in each year, a true and accurate account of the amount of all certificates so as aforesaid by them issued.

Allowance to jurymen at-

IV. And be it enacted, That from and after the first day of February next there shall be allowed to each grand and petit juryman attending the several county courts, &c. ty courts in this state, the sum of seven shillings and six-pence current money for each and every day such grand and petit juryman shall attend for the discharge of his duty as fuch, to be allowed, affessed and levied, in the several and respective counties of this state, in the same manner as the allowances to jurymen have heretofore been affeffed and levied.

V. Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing in this act contained, fo far as it respects the allowance to be made to the grand and petit jurors in the Proviso. feveral counties, shall extend to Allegany county.

VI. and be it enacted, That all laws heretofore passed, whereby any other repealed, &c. allowance is directed to be made to any juryman for his attendance as aforesaid, be and the same are hereby repealed, so far as the same shall be repugnant to, or in any manner inconsistent with, the provisions contained in this act.

An ACT to confirm the title of certain lots of ground to the fociety of people called Quakers, in Baltimore-town, whereon is cember 28. their meeting-house and burying-ground.

Preamble.

THEREAS it is represented to this legislature, by the monthly meeting of the people called Quakers, in Baltimore-town, that they are seized and possessed of a lot of ground on the east side of Jones's falls, in-
