The Speaker laid before the House the Special Orders of the Day being:

House Bill No. 44—Interest and Usury.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 4 of Article 49 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1964 Replacement Volume), title "Interest and Usury," to provide that any person guilty of usury shall forfeit ALL THE EXCESS ABOVE the real sum or value of the goods and chattels actually lent or advanced and all interest charges thereon.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I am returning herewith House Bill 44, 1965 Session, which has been vetoed by me today.

In view of the Attorney General's comprehensive and technical analysis of the Bill, I am setting forth *in toto* his opinion letter of April 6, 1965:
