

TUESDAY, January 21st, 1840.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolutions reported from the committee of the whole, on the subject of the Independent Treasury;

Were sent to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the House the report of the Board of Visitors of the Maryland Hospital;

Read and referred to Messrs. Berry, Graves and Selby.

Mr. Matthews presented the reports from the State Tobacco Inspectors, at the Warehouses No. 1 & 2, in reference to monies paid by them into the treasury;

Read and referred to the committee on inspections.

Mr. Mason presented the memorial of Reverdy Johnson, Esq., in relation to the proposed investigation into the cause of the failure of the Bank of Maryland, and his alleged participation in them;

Mr. Mason moved to refer the same to the committee already raised on that subject;

Mr. Spencer moved that the same be laid on the table;
