Also, an unfavorable report on the application of John Tull, and Barsheba Tull;

Read, and on motion of Mr. Long,

Ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Frazier,

The committee to whom was referred the leave to report a bill in reference to pilots, was increased by adding thereto, Messrs. Frazier, Cottman, Blakistone and Heckart.

The House then took up for consideration the bills in order entitled to a second reading;

The first bill in order is the bill entitled, a supplement to an act to regulate the inspection of salted fish, in the city of Baltimore,

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

Said bill was laid on the table.

The next bill in order is the bill entitled, an act for the reassessment and valuation of the real and personal property in Somerset county;

Read the second time.

Mr. Cottman moved to amend said bill by adding thereto the following:

Sec. 16. Be it enacted, That the commissioners of Somerset county be, and they are hereby authorised and required to cause the foregoing act to be published, as soon as received, in some newspaper printed in said county, for three successive weeks, and to pay for the same as other county charges are paid.

On the question being put, will the House agree to amend?

Determined in the affirmative.

Said bill as amended was passed and sent to the Senate.
