

report was made by the committee on internal improvements of the last House of Delegates other than the one marked Document U, which is to be found among the printed public documents.

It gives your committee great pleasure to state that any impression which may have existed in minds of any individuals that any other report than Document U, above referred to, had been made, and subsequently withdrawn or suppressed, in violation of the rules of the House, is entirely unfounded and unjust; the committee are unanimous in exonerating every one from the slightest imputation of such a nature.

Though your committee are satisfied that no report was ever made under the order of the 7th January 1839, yet they have discovered that the enquiry directed by that order was prosecuted with a zeal becoming its importance, and that the committee collected a large mass of valuable testimony, but which the chairman never embodied in a report to the House in consequence of the delay in one of the witnesses to hand in his answers to interrogatories. All the testimony taken by the committee of the last House of Delegates it is believed, is now in the possession of your committee, and which will be submitted to the House under the order adopted on motion of Mr. Ridgely on the 10th instant as soon as it can be properly arranged.
