

The House then took up for consideration bills in order entitled to a second reading.

The first bill in order is the bill entitled, an act to pay jurors in Baltimore for removed cases from Harford counties, and for other purposes therein mentioned;

Said bill was then read, and on motion of Mr. Holmes made the order of the day for Monday next.

The house adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

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MONDAY, January 27th, 1840.

The House met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to allow Samuel Jordan further time to complete his collection;

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the German Catholic Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

And the bill entitled, an act relating to public landings in Harford county;

Were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Long presented the petition of Charles Wallace and others, of Somerset county, praying that a law may be passed for the more effectual preservation of the oysters in the Waters of said county;

Read and referred to Messrs. Long, Cottman and Humphreys.

Mr. Humphreys presented the petition of John Parsons and others, of Somerset county, praying that a law may be passed for the establishment of a public road therein mentioned;

Read and referred to Messrs. Humphreys, Cottman and Long.

Mr. Biser presented the petition of Joseph Talbott of Frederick county, praying the passage of an act to distribute his property by lot, and for other purposes therein mentioned;

Read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Sutton presented the petition of residents of Havre De Grace and its vicinity, in Harford county, praying the passage of an act authorising the raising of a sum of money by lottery, for the purpose of erecting a Town Hall for the beneficial purposes therein mentioned;

Read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Hellen presented the petition of sundry persons of Calvert county, praying for a pension for William Smith;

Read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. Sutton presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying that William Dulin may be placed on the pension roll of said county;

Read and referred to the same committee.

Ordered, that Mr. Quynn have leave of absence till Saturday next.
