So the bill was rejected.

Mr. Bowie submitted the following preamble and resolution:

Whereas, it is now manifest that the business of the present session of the Legislature cannot be completed before the time limited by the constitution for its close; and whereas, the business yet to be acted upon relates chiefly to the finances of the State, and of the preservation of the faith and credit of the State—therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That his excellency the Governor be, and he is hereby requested, to issue his proclamation, convening the Legislature on the 12th inst.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time;

The Speaker announced that the hour had arrived for taking up the order of the day;

Mr. Martin moved to suspend the rule requiring the order of the day to be taken up.

The Speaker gave it as the opinion of the chair, that, under the order adopted on Saturday, the motion of Mr. Martin was not in order.

The house then proceeded to the consideration of the order of the day.

On motion of Mr. Gaither.

The house again resolved itself into a committee of the whole house upon the unfinished order of Saturday, being the bill reported by Mr. Bowie, chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, (Mr. Jones, of Somerset, being in the chair;) and after some time spent in committee, the Speaker resumed the chair, and the chairman reported that the said committee had, in obedience to order, had said bill again under consideration, and having made some progress therein, had directed him to ask leave to sit again;

Which leave was granted by the house.
