The house met.

The clerk of the senate delivered the engrossed bills of the senate from No. 94 to No. 117 inclusive;

Which were severally read, assented to, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Forman, chairman of the committee on engrossed bills delivered the following report:

The committee on engrossed bills, beg leave to report that they have carefully examined and compared the engrossed bills of the House of Delegates, from No. 1 to 93 inclusive, and the resolutions from No. 1, to 10 inclusive, with the original as passed, at the present session, and that they have found the same to be truly engrossed.

The engrossed bills of the House of Delegates, from No. 1 to No. 93, also the engrossed resolutions from No. 1 to No. 10 inclusive,

A deputation from the senate being announced, Messrs. Maulsby and Willson, members of that body, appeared within the bar of the house, and informed the Speaker, that his Excellency, the Governor, was attending in the Senate Chamber, and requested the attendance of the house, to see him sign and seal the laws.

The Speaker, attended by the members of the house, went to the Senate Chamber, when his Excellency, the Governor, in the presence of both houses, signed and affixed the Great Seal to the engrossed bills, from No. 1 to No. 93 inclusive.

The Speaker, with the rest of the members, returned and resumed the chair.

On motion of Mr. Presstman,

The house took up for consideration, the report and resolution submitted by him on the 25th ultimo, in relation to the University of Maryland:

Mr. Gaither moved that said report and resolution be referred to the committee on ways and means;

Determined in the negative.

The said report and resolution were then read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to.

Mr. Martin obtained leave to introduce a bill, entitled a supplement to an act passed at the present session, entitled an act to establish a uniform system of charges by notaries public in this State, so far as the same relates to Talbot county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Martin, Lowe, and Willis, report the same.
