Ordered, That Messrs. Maccubbin, Tuck, and Bowie, report the same.

Mr. Gaither submitted the following order:

Ordered, That after Wednesday next, no new business will be received or entertained by this house,

Which was twice read;

On motion of Mr. Shower,

Said order was amended by adding at the end thereof the words "except on petition,"

The question then recurred and was put, will the house adopt said order as amended,

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Frazier,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled a supplement to an act passed December session 1829, chapter 202, relative to the taking of testimony in all applications for divorce;

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

On motion of Mr. E. A. Lynch,

The house took up for consideration the resolutions from the senate, for the retrocession, to the State of Maryland, of that portion of the territory of the District of Columbia lying west of Rock creek, and the amendments reported thereto from the committee.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Said resolutions and amendments were laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Somerset,

Leave was granted the committee on crimes and punishments to bring in a bill, to be entitled an additional supplement to the act, entitled an act for the more effectual protection of public worship in this State, passed December session 1824, ch. 53.

On motion of Mr. Orrell,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house, the petition of sundry citizens of the upper district of Caroline county, praying the passage of an act to establish a primary school in the upper district of said county, in school district number three.
