The house met.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled an act to authorise the drawing of a lottery to introduce a supply of wholesome water in the town of Port Tobacco, in Charles county;

Also the bill, entitled an act for the relief of Douglass Green, of Frederick county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to authorise Richard R. Waters, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, to complete his collections;

Also the bill, entitled an act for the benefit of Thomas W. Vinson, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, and William N. Austin, trustee of William O'Neal, late sheriff and collector of said county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Middletown, in Frederick county, to the Chesapeake and Ohio canal, at some point thereon in the Catoctin Valley, between the Catoctin and Blue Ridge mountain;

Also the bill, entitled an act to change the location of the school now located at Townsend's cross roads, in the middle election district in Caroline county, to a place called Chinquepin Ridge, in the same district;

Also the bill, entitled an act to consolidate the free school fund, the State's donation, and the surplus revenue fund, so far as relates to district school No. 3, in the upper district of Caroline county, and for other purposes;

Also the bill, entitled an act for the benefit of Isaac C. Anderson, collector of Howard District, in Anne Arundel county;

Also the bill, entitled an additional supplement to an act, entitled an act for the relief of the poor of Worcester county, passed February 13th, 1822, ch. 154;

Also the bill, entitled an act to alter and change, in part, the division line between election districts No. 6 and 7, in Washington county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to lay off a new primary school district in Anne Arundel county; and

The bill, entitled an act to make valid the proceedings of the commissioners of Charles county, and to authorise the appointment of an inspector of tobacco at Port Tobacco warehouse, in said county;

Severally endorsed "will pass" and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill entitled an act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to license wood hucksters in the city of Baltimore;

And, the bill entitled an act to lay out, open and make public, a road in Frederick and Carroll counties;
