Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George G. Brewer, chief clerk of the House of Delegates, and Joseph H. Nicholson, chief clerk of the Senate, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of the several accounts that may, from time to time, be presented to him, by said clerks, for newspapers furnished the members of the legislature during the sessions of December 1840, and March 1841; and that he also pay the amounts for postage upon letters forwarded and received by said clerks relative to the duties of their respective offices.
