So the bill was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, moved to amend the title of said bill by striking out the title and substituting in lieu thereof the following: "an act to provide for the suspension of specie payments by the banks."

Mr. Ghiselin called for the previous question, and being demanded by a majority of the members present, the said previous question was put, that is, "shall the main question be now put?" and It was resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, on the motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Cecil, to amend the title of said bill; and

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Purnell then moved to amend the title of said bill by striking out all after the word "entitled," and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "an act to authorise the banks to issue small notes;"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Purnell then moved to amend the title of said bill by adding at the end thereof the following: "and to authorise the banks to issue small notes;"

Determined in the negative.

The House then resumed the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill reported by Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, chairman of the select committee on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The House again resolved itself into a committee of the Whole House upon said bill, (Mr. Kilgour being in the chair,) and after some time spent in committee, the Speaker resumed the chair, and the Chairman reported, that the said committee had in obedience to order, had had said bill again under consideration, and having made some progress therein, had directed him to ask leave to sit again, which leave was granted by the House.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for the weighing of anthracite coal, and for the measuring of bituminous coal, passed at December session 1837, ch. 316;

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Hasson and James Lile of Cecil county;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution in relation to academies in Baltimore county;

Also, the preamble and resolutions in relation to the issue of two hundred millions of Government stock for the relief of the States;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed.
