Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation, to bring in a bill to incorporate the Great Gunpowder Falls Manufacturing Company in Baltimore county;

Mr. Fletcher submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be allowed sixty dollars, and no more, annually, for the purpose of hiring and paying for services necessarily connected with the Library;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, "assented to," and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Kilgour submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of Maryland pay to William McVier, printer of the Senate, the sum of five hundred dollars, out of any unappropriated monies in the Treasury.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, "assented to," and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian, be hereby authorised and directed to deliver to the Maryland Historical Society, a copy of each of the State publications, of which there may be more than ten copies in the Library.
