

Cumberland, and that the mining companies of Allegany county or the citizens of said county, shall likewise file with the Treasurer good and sufficient bonds with security to be by him approved that not less than two hundred thousand tons of coal shall annually be conveyed upon the canal from Cumberland to Georgetown;”

Which was read.

On the question being put,

“Will the House accept the substitute?”

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon the amendment, as offered by Mr. Tall, and

Resolved in the affirmative.
