

FRIDAY, February 21st, 1845.

The House dispensed with the reading of the Journal of proceedings.

The Speaker announced the following message as having been received from the Senate on yesterday:

The bill entitled, an act changing the time for the appointment of supervisors of the public roads in Cecil county, and authorising and empowering the president and clerk of the county commissioners of said county, to administer oaths and take affirmations in certain cases;

Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act relating to the citizens Bank of Baltimore;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to alter and change a portion of the main road leading from Frederick to Georgetown;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to limit the powers of the commissioners of Washington county, and

The bill entitled, an act to allow William Bryan, trustee of William and Lewis N. Sewell, further time to complete his collections;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the members of the Baltimore Club;

Endorsed, "will not pass."

Also, the resolution requesting his Excellency the Governor, to transmit certain resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, and

The preamble and resolution in relation to the 4th instalment of the surplus revenue of the General Government;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and the resolutions ordered to be engrossed.
