On motion of Mr. Raymond,

Ordered, That the proceedings and resolutions adopted at a meeting held by the citizens in the 1st election district in Carroll county, on the subject of reform and retrenchment &c., referred by the Senate to the consideration of this House, be referred to the committee on Retrenchment.

On motion of Mr. Ford, of Queen Anne's,

Leave was granted the Queen Anne's county delegation, to bring in a bill to authorise the assignment of certain indentures therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Lamden,

Leave was granted the committee on Colord Population, to bring in a bill making a registry necessary for all free negroes, passengers in steamboats or sail boats, cars or any other species of conveyance travelling from any county of this State.

On motion of Mr. Lamden,

Leave was granted the Worcester county delegation, to bring in a bill to repeal an act passed at December session 1842, chapter 4;

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, asked the following leave:

Leave to bring in a bill to repeal an act entitled, an act relating to the practice of the Court of Appeals, and of the second judicial district, in certain cases;

Which was read,

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, moved that said leave be referred to a select committee of five;

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, moved that said leave be referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put on the motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, to refer said leave to a select committee, and Resolved in the affirmative.

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Hollyday of Kent, Archer, Calvert, Hollyday, of Cecil and Purnell, to compose the committee.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act of 1837, providing for the weighing of live stock in the city of Baltimore.
