

Mr. Tall presented the petition of Richard Condon, of Dorchester county, praying for the payment of money due his deceased uncle, William Condon, a soldier of the Revolution, the said petitioner being the heir at law;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

Mr. Tall also, presented the petition of Samuel Dunnock, and two hundred and forty-four other citizens of Dorchester county, praying for an act to abolish the wood huckstering in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Pennsylvania, praying the General Assembly of Maryland, to incorporate a Rail Road Company, by the name of the Bedford Mineral Spring Rail Road Company, to intersect the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road at Cumberland, Maryland;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, presented the memorial of Thomas W. Letson, accompanied with a copy of a contract which he had made with the President of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, for completing said canal on particular conditions therein contained;

Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, also, presented the proceedings of a meeting held at the Brick School House in Petersville district, Frederick county, on Saturday the 1st inst., on the subject of the State debt of Maryland, retrenchment, &c.
