

The question before the House being upon the motion of Mr. Bowie, to amend the 9th section 2nd line of the bill by striking out all after the word "thereof;" and insert the following: "and the company hereby incorporated shall be subject to all the restrictions imposed ;"

Which was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore county,

Said bill was further amended by adding at the end thereof the following proviso:

"Provided, That nothing in this act shall so be construed as to deprive any further Legislature of the right to alter, amend or repeal said act ;"

The said bill having been read through as amended, was passed, and sent to the Senate.
