On motion of Mr. Ford, of Queen Anne's,

Leave was granted Messrs. Ford, of Queen Anne's, Muse and Polk, to bring in a bill to repeal an act therein mentioned;

On motion of Mr. Ford, of St. Mary's,

Leave was granted the St. Mary's county delegation, to bring in a bill to make valid a certain deed of conveyance from Nicolaus Furck and others, to Anne A. Carpenter, of St. Mary's county;

On motion of Mr. Guiselin,

Leave was granted the committee on Colored Population, to bring in a bill to exempt Moses Lake and his wife of the city of Annapolis, from the operation of an act passed at the present session repealing a part of the 2nd section of an act passed December session 1831, ch. 323.

On motion of Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore county,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to bring in a bill to incorporate the Eagle Artillery Company of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Springer,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation, to bring in a bill to change the name of Joseph Huyghe, of the city of Baltimore, to that of Joseph Hayghe.

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Leave was granted the Montgomery county delegation, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to extend the time for making out, delivering and collecting the fees of attornies and officers of Montome-ry county court and register of wills of said county.
