

Mr. Freeman submitted the following resolutions:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That Robert McGraw, John S. Smith, John Philpot, Henry C. Pike, Sheppard C. Leakin, be and they are hereby appointed Directors on the part of the State in the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company.

Resolved, That the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Delegates, address a joint letter to each of the above named gentlemen, informing them respectively of their appointment.

Which were read the first and by a special order the second time, "assented to," and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Springer reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of Joseph Huyghe, of the city of Baltimore, to that of Joseph Hayghe, and

Mr. Biser reported a bill entitled, an act authorising the levy court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money, if in their judgment they deem it advisable, to re-build a bridge over Toms' creek, on the road leading from Frederick to Emmitsburg;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, of A. A.,

The House took up for consideration the motion of Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, submitted on the 21st instant, to reconsider the vote of the House upon the bill entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes;

On the question being put,

"Will the House reconsider their vote?"

It was determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Fooks,

The yeas and nays were ordered;

Pending which, the doorkeeper returned and reported, that he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the House was required.

The House then resumed the consideration of the bill reported by Mr. Biser, entitled, an act to provide for taking the vote of the people of this State, as to the expediency of calling a convention, to reform the present or frame a new Constitution, so to amend the existing Constitution as to enable the Legislature to call a convention;

The question before the House being upon the motion of Mr. Calvert, for the previous question;

The said previous question was then put, that is shall the main question be now put, and

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, on the motion of Mr. Hughes, to strike out the enacting clause of the bill, and

Resolved in the affirmative.
