Mr. Morsell moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following:

"Be it enacted, That in all cases where any individual shall pay his taxes according to the provisions of this act, then he shall not be chargeable with interest;"

Mr. Calvert moved to amend said amendment, by striking out words "this act" and inserting in lieu thereof, the words "former acts;"

Resolved in the affirmative.

The question then recurred and was put on the amendment as amended, and

Determined in the negative.

The said bill having been read through as amended,

The question was then put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative.
