The House met.

The bill reported by Mr. Gallagher entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore;

Was taken up for consideration;

Read the second time, passed and sent to Senate.

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, presented the application of Joseph Wicks, deputy attorney, to be reimbursed for money expended by him;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Claims.

The bill from the Senate entitled, an act to incorporate the New York Mining Company;

The bill reported by Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore county entitled, an act empowering the commissioners of Baltimore county, to repair or rebuild a bridge over the Great Gunpowder Falls at Cromwell's Ford, and

The bill reported by Mr. Patterson entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1841, ch. 182, entitled, an act to provide for the election of the commissioners of Montgomery county, by the people;

Were severally taken up for consideration;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Hiram Astley;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Long entitled, an act for the benefit of the trustees of the Presbyterian church at Fork town in Worcester county.

The bill from the Senate entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Fire Insurance Company, in Harford county, passed at Dec. session 1842;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Ford, of Queen Anne's, entitled, an act to authorise the assignment of certain indentures therein mentioned;

Was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Long,

Said bill was referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Frazier,

Leave was granted Messrs. Frazier, Harrison and Randall, to bring in a bill for the better protection of camp meetings in this State.
