Mr. Bowdle presented the petition of the trustees of primary school district No. 2, in election district No. 3, of Talbot county, and other citizens, praying the passage of an act therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the Talbot county delegation.

Mr. Morsell presented the memorial of George Thomas, John Hopwood, and others of Calvert county, praying for a modification in the license laws;

Which was read and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Muse presented the memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act exempting the furniture of boarders in private boarding houses from distress;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Muse, Shriver and Graves.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore county,

Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation, to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Hereford circuit in Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Randall,

Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation, to bring in a bill to incorporate the trustees of Greenland academy, in Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday, of Kent,

Leave was granted Messrs. Hollyday, of Kent, Harrison, Hollyday, of Cecil, Goldsborough and Ford, of Queen Anne's, to bring in a bill to incorporate a company to be styled the Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's, and Talbot counties.

Mr. Hopewell, chairman of the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims, made unfavorable reports upon the following petitions, viz:
