On the question being put, on discharging the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, from the consideration of said memorial and referring the same to the select committee appointed on the subject of retrenchment and State expenditures;

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Hellen presented the report of the Orphans court of Calvert county, relative to the school fund of said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

The statements from the clerks of the county courts and registers of wills, relative to the number of years they have been in office, the amount of their receipts, &c.;

Was ordered to be printed.

On motion of Mr. Patterson,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the House, the petition of F. S. Poole, trustee and administrator of J. R. Poole, praying to be released from the payment of interest on the fourth instalment of the direct tax of 1843.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, of Balt. county,

Leave was granted the Baltimore county delegation, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county, to divide in equal proportions between the city of Baltimore and county, the Baltimore and Havre de Grace Road Company's stock, standing in the name of the levy court of Baltimore county, and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

Leave was granted the committee on Inspections, to bring in a supplement to the act entitled, an act providing for the appointment of lime inspectors in the city of Baltimore, and prescribing their duties, so as to provide for an appeal from the decision of the inspectors, in the event of either the manufacturer or purchaser or consumer, desiring such appeal.

Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of Saint Mary's Church in Carroll county;

Mr. Graves from the committee on Ways and Means, reported a bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act for general valuation and assessment of property, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, passed at March session 1841, chapter 23;

Mr. Raymond from the committee on Ways and Means, reported a bill entitled, an act to secure the payment of the income tax by the officers of incorporated companies; and explanatory of certain acts of assembly therein mentioned;

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act relating to the practice of the Court of Ap-
