Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled a supplement to an act entitled, an act to extend the charters of the several banks of the city of Baltimore;

Also, from the same committee, made a favorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore county, entitled, an act to incorporate the Great Gunpowder Falls manufacturing company;

Which bills were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Frazier reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the more effectual protection of public worship in the State, passed at December session 1824, ch. 53;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The House resumed the consideration of the bill reported by Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on Colored Population, entitled, an act to encourage the more effectual apprehending of runaway servants and slaves.

Mr. Lankford moved to strike out in the 4th line, 1st section, "twenty," and insert "forty;"
