Mr. Potter reported a bill entitled, an act to allow James W. Saulsbury, late collector of Caroline county, further time to complete his collections;

Mr. Hollyday, of Kent, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported a bill entitled, an act for the extension of the time of William H. Blackstone, collector of Kent county, to complete his collections;

Mr. Long reported a bill entitled, an act in relation to the United States Road;

Mr. Archer reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise S. Teakle Wallis, to bring into this State a negro slave therein named;

Mr. Biser reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Farmers' and Mechanics' Band of Middletown valley ;

Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on Colored Population, reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Daniel Badley, of Somerset county ;

Also, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Moter, of Frederick county ;

Mr. Clarke from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed of manumission therein mentioned ;

Mr. Potter from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of Alexander B. Gordon, of the city of Baltimore ; and

Mr. Hughes, chairman of select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Henrietta Roberts and Henry M. Robey, administrators of Allison Roberts, of Charles county ;
