Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Ware submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the resolution passed on the 3rd day of February, 1845, for the distribution of the eight hundred dollars annually allowed Baltimore county, for colleges and academies, be construed to be in force and take effect from and after the 1st day of January, 1845; and that the Treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby required forthwith to pay over the said eight hundred dollars to the academies therein named;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Archer submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Directors on the part of the State in the Baltimore and Susquehanna rail road company, and other works of internal improvement, be and they are hereby directed to investigate the affairs of said companies, and report thereon to the next Legislature; and also, to enquire whether the salaries of officers and other expenses of said companies, cannot be reduced with advantage to the State, and to exert their power and influence to effect such retrenchment as may be practicable and proper;
