So the House refused to suspend the rules.

It requiring a vote of two-thirds.

The question then recurred upon the motion of Mr. Tall, to reconsider the vote of the House upon striking out the enacting clause of the bill entitled, an act imposing duties on promissory notes, bills of exchange, specialties and other instruments of writing, to aid in paying the debts of the State.

The House by unanimous consent, resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the door keeper.

The clerk of the Senate returned the resolution appointing directors on the part of the State in the Branch Bank at Easton;

Endorsed "assented to," and the resolution ordered to be engrossed.
