

Mr. Hopewell from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain real estate in St. Mary's county :

Mr. Johnson, of A. A., reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Benjamin T. Pindle, and his sureties ;

Mr. Goldsborough reported a bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at Dec. session 1843, ch. 132, to authorise the trustees of school district No. 2, in election district No. 1, of Talbot county, to levy a tax for the payment of rent due for school houses in said district ;

Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore city, reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of justices of the peace, and of constables for Canton, in Baltimore county ;

Mr. Shriver reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Frederick county, in their discretion, to apply to the repairs of the court house in said county, the money heretofore levied for the erection of a new court house in said county ;

Mr. Long reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the completion of certain records of the Orphans court of Somerset county ;

Mr. Lankford reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at Dec. session 1843, ch. 308, and

Mr. Clarke reported a bill entitled, an act making additional provision for the crier of Washington county court ;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order, the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Muse reported a bill entitled, an act respecting boarding houses ;

Which was read the first and second time by a special order.

Mr. Frazier moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof as an additional section, the following :

"Sec. 3rd. And be it enacted, That the sum of money paid for said registration, be paid by said clerk or clerks into the Treasury ;"

Mr. Worthington, of Baltimore county, moved to amend said amendment by adding at the end thereof these words, "deducting therefrom twenty-five cents for the clerks fee ;"

Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put on the amendment as amended, and Resolved in the affirmative.

The question then recurred and was put,

"Shall the said bill pass?"

Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the Senate.

Mr. Thomas reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the trustees of the primary schools of St. Mary's county ;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.
