

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, submitted the following order:

Ordered, That during the residue of the session, no gentleman shall occupy the floor at one time longer than fifteen minutes, nor be permitted to speak more than once on the same question, unless in explanation;

Which was twice read.

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Said order was amended by striking out "fifteen," and inserting in lieu thereof, "thirty."

The question then recurred and was put on the adoption of the order as amended, and

Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Williams, of Baltimore city, submitted the following order:

Ordered, That no motion shall be in order to read a bill, resolution or report by special order, without the unanimous consent of the members of the House; but that all bills, resolutions and reports shall be acted on in the order of time when the same were introduced into the House, or brought from the Senate, except amendments from the Senate. And where a bill, resolution or report is postponed, it shall be placed at the foot of the calendar of bills, and only be acted on when thus reached in the regular call of bills, &c. for second reading;

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Gallagher presented the memorial of the Rev. James Dolan, William Henderson and Richard McDonnald, praying for the passage of an act to incorporate the trustees of Saint Patrick's school;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Polk presented the petition of Charles S. Sewell, and other citizens of Harford county, praying an alteration in the donation to the several academies in said county;

Which was read and referred to the Harford county delegation.

Mr. Polk also presented the petition of Francis McMahon, and other citizens of Harford county, praying to grant to the Baltimore and Harford turnpike company, their application for a proposed change at a certain point of said road;

Which was read and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Neff presented the memorial of Andrew Gondor, and other citizens of Allegany county, in favor of H. Smouse, and for other purposes.

Which was read and referred to the Allegany county delegation.
