

On motion of Mr. Muse,

Leave was granted the committee on Lotteries, to bring in a bill providing that all tickets or parts of tickets in the consolidated lotteries of this State, or in other lotteries which may be hereafter authorised, shall be authenticated by the signatures of one at least of the commissioners of lotteries, either written or stamped.

Mr. Harrison submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer pay to the Rev. Mr. Van'Dusen, Chaplain to the Senate, and to the Rev. Mr. Steele, Chaplain to the House of Delegates, each the sum of one hundred dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, as a remuneration for their services during the present session of the Legislature;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hellen submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the orphan's court of Calvert county, be, and they are hereby required and directed to invest from time to time, as they may deem necessary, any surplus monies belonging to the common school fund of said county in stocks of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland, or in any other manner best calculated to promote said fund;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hance submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State wharfinger cause the water in front of the State tobacco warehouse in the city of Baltimore numbered three, to be deepened, so as to float vessels of the draft usually landing at the said wharf, and that he be authorised to apply for that purpose, the necessary amount of money arising from wharfages in said city, not exceeding the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars:

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Muse presented an account of Thomas H. Hooper against the State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Claims.

Mr. Jump reported a bill entitled, an act to make a public road therein mentioned;

Mr. Stewart reported a bill entitled, an act relating to the commissioners for Howard District, and

Mr. Hellen reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for electing the levy court of Calvert county, passed at Dec. session 1838, ch. 259;

Which were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.
