Section 3. And be it enacted, That the official bonds of said clerks and registers, shall be answerable for the taxes herein provided; and that upon failure or neglect of any of the aforesaid clerks or registers, to pay the taxes provided by this act, by the times in this act limited for the payment thereof, it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to report such neglect or refusal to the Governor, who shall thereupon by letter demand of such clerk or register the payment of such tax and upon the refusal or neglect of such clerk or register to pay such tax within thirty days thereafter, he shall forfeit and be liable to pay treble the amount hereby assessed and levied upon him by this act.
