Section 7. And be it enacted, That before this act shall be operative, the Judges of election at the next election for Mayor and City Council, shall ask of every voter whether he is "for" or "against" the division of the city as hereinbefore provided for—and if a majority of legal voters shall decide "for" the law, then and in no other case shall the provisions of this act be of any effect.
