The House met.

Mr. Freeman, chairman of the committee on engrossed bills delivered the following

REPORT :

Which was twice read and concurred in.

The engrossed bills of the House of Delegates from number sixty-five to two hundred and three inclusive.

Were severally read, "assented to" and sent to the Senate.

The clerk of the Senate returned the said bills;

Severally endorsed, read and "assented to;"

And delivered the engrossed bills of the Senate from number two hundred and four to number two hundred and thirty-one inclusive;

Which were severally read "assented to" and returned to the Senate.

A deputation from the Senate being announced, Messrs. Sellman and Townsend, members of that body appeared within the bar of the House and informed the Speaker that his Excellency the Governor, was attending in the Senate Chamber, and requested the attendance of this House to see him sign and seal the Laws;

The Speaker attended by the members of the House went to the Senate Chamber, where his Excellency the Governor in the presence of both Houses, signed and affixed the Great Seal of the State to the engrossed bills, from number sixty-five to number two hundred and three inclusive;

The Speaker with the rest of the members returned and resumed the chair.

Leave was granted the Montgomery county delegation to bring in a bill for the relief Thomas L. Hays.
