The House took up for consideration the report of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, submitted on the 11th ultimo, on the order of the House requiring said committee to enquire into the expediency of limiting the tenure of the offices of Chancellor and Judges in the several judicial districts, and to reduce the number of judges in certain districts ; and the report of the minority of said committee, proposed as a substitute therefor, and the bills accompanying the same ;

The question was put on accepting as a substitute for the report of the majority,

"The bill accompanying the report of the minority entitled, an act to limit the tenure of office of Attorney General ;" and

Determined in the negative.
