Dear Dr. Everstine:

In accordance with Section 19 (Annexation) of Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland 1957 (1966 Replacement Volume) and Section 17A of said Article, the following material is herewith submitted for registration:

1) Original boundaries of the Mayor and Common Council of Westminster as taken from Section 738 of the Public Local Laws of Carroll County, Everstine, 1965, and in Section 523 of Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930) Flack's Edition, the boundaries of Annexation No. 1, annexed in 1967 and new boundaries called Annexation No. 3. (Annexation No. 2 was defeated by referendum in 1969).

2) Copies of Minutes of The Mayor and Common Council of Westminster of August 8, 1968 and September 9, 1968 showing introduction and enactment and adoption of resolution for annexation. The resolution was unanimously enacted and adopted.

The resolution was not petitioned for referendum. The effective date of the resolution was 46 days following its enactment.
