

James Donaldson his Exec<sup>r</sup>, Admirer and Assignee from all  
 Sutes, troubles, Delay's, Arrests, or Incumbrances whatsoever  
 during the voyage aforesaid of any person or persons whatsoever  
 claiming any right or Interest in the said Vessel and especially  
 of what may happen or arise to the prejudice of the said  
 James from a certain William Whittin<sup>g</sup>ton Senior of the Island  
 of ~~the Island~~ Barbadoes, and that he the said William Whitt-  
 ington or his aforesaid, shall procure and get a legal  
 and sufficient Register for the said Vessel, and make her  
 a free bottom of the province of Maryland before she proceed  
 on the voyage aforesaid, and lastly that he the said William  
 his Executors or Administrators shall pay or cause to be  
 paid at his own proper cost, all port Charges, pilotage or  
 any other charge whatsoever accruing on acc<sup>t</sup> of the  
 said Vessel, at any port or ports at which the said Vessel  
 shall arrive at during the said voyage. In consideration  
 whereof and of the full and true performance of the  
 severall clauses covenants and agreements abovespeci-  
 fied the said James Donaldson for himself his Exec<sup>r</sup>s  
 and Admirer doth covenant bargain and agree to and with  
 the said William Whittin<sup>g</sup>ton his Exec<sup>r</sup> and Administra-  
 tors that he the said James his Exec<sup>r</sup> and Admirer shall  
 and will pay or cause to be paid unto the said William his  
 Exec<sup>r</sup>s Admirer or assignee as freight for his thirteen parts  
 of fifteen of the aforesaid Vessel the full and just sum of  
 forty pounds thirteen shillings and four pence current  
 money of Maryland for every month the said Vessel shall  
 be in performing the voyage aforesaid, which time is to  
 commence from the day and Date of these presents and  
 to continue till she shall arrive from the west Indies, or  
 any other port and deliver her loading up<sup>r</sup> at the port of  
 Annapolis abovesmentioned provided always and it is  
 hereby expressly agreed and declared that in case the  
 said Brigantine should at any port where she shall arrive  
 at during her said voyage, be kept either by any Embargo  
 laid by the government in the Harbour Port or road where  
 she shall then lye or anchor at or by the Neglect of the said  
 Vessel, for want of men mariners, victuals, apparell or  
 ground tackle or any other account whatsoever Except
