and in the Meane time to keep the peace to all
Persons Especially to John Davis wherewith he
acknowledged himself content this 12 October
1734 before me one of His Lordships Justices of
Said County of Kent — Jos Harris

And now here at this Court to wit at Kent
County at the Court house in the town of Chestor
Said County Came Jos. Nicholson & Nicholas
and in his proper person appeared and prayed
that his Recognizance be discharged ~~and~~
Ordered by this Court here that the said Jos
& his Associates be discharged as prayed and

Jos. Nicholas was his Recognizance taken for
the sum of Twenty pounds maintaining for his
Appearance at our next Court to answer unto
what shall be alleged against him, and
in the meane time to be of good behaviour the
same Recognizance is by this Court discharged
the charge of Jos. Nicholas & his Associates is
discharged as prayed and Jos. Harris
as an Eyewitness

After which the grand jury returns a bill of
Indictment which is as follows —

Honourable the Lord properly that now is for the
body of Kent County and upon their Oath present
that Jos. Nicholson late of St. Pauls Parish in
the County of Kent the twelfth day of October 1734
Died between the hundred thirty and four at the
