The said Indulgent was then ordered as follows by
the Court in 1734. A true Bill of Peace for the
said of Kent County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County
on the third Tuesday in November being the twentieth day of said Month
Anno Domini one thousand Seven hundred and thirty four came the said Robert
in his prop. person and his attorney by his attorney and the said Robert
prayed that the said cause might be continued until next Court was
granted being the third Tuesday in March.
All which was ordered being the third Tuesday in March.
