His Lordship. The said Thomas being Constable
of Lower South Saffron Hundred
Thomas Tason did not take the taxables of a certain
Edward Lewis according to acts of
Assembly &c. thereupon the Court orders that his Lordship's
Warrant of Indictment for said Court Exhibit an Information
against the same Thomas Tason for the offence aforesaid after
which another said Atty and Exhibited the Information as
follows Viz. to
Shut County. Be it remembered that Sir Francis
Gent Atty of the Right Honorable the Lord Proprietary
that now is for the same Lord Proprietary in this part prosecut-
eth doth come herunto the County Court for the same Lord
Proprietary held for that County aforesaid to Wit at Chester town
in the County aforesaid the Nineteenth day of November Anno Domini
Seventeen Hundred and thirty four before James Harris Esq
and his Associates the same Lord Proprietary his Justice
of the same County Court and for the same Lord Proprietary
doth give this same Justice here to understand and be informed
that Thomas Tason of Lower South Saffron Hundred in the
County aforesaid planter the Tuesday of November Anno Domini
Seventeen Hundred thirty and two then and there inhabitant
within the said Hundred being was legally then and there
elected and appointed to be the said Thomas afterwards to
Wit the same day and year had notice and the oath of Constable
then and there in due form did take and the said Thomas
was continued Constable of the same Hundred from the same
third Tuesday of November until the twenty first day of
June Anno Domini Seventeen Hundred thirty and three
to wit at the Hundred aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of this
Court. Nevertheless the said Thomas the duty of his
said Office not regarding on the twentieth day of June
in the same year or at any time before did not repair
in person to the Dwelling house of Edward Lewis of the
said Hundred and County planter the same Edward the
same day and year and for a long time next before
