and Exhibited the Information as follows vizt

in this Court prosecuteth doth come here into Court of

understand and be informed that a certain Thos Tasson
of Lower South Saxford Hundred in the County and shert
on the third Tuesday of Nov. which was in the year of
our Lord God Seventeen Hundred thirty and two and
always afterwards untill the day of the Exhibition of
this Information being an inhabitant and resident
within the said Hundred and County and within the
Jurisdiction of this Court and a fit man to Execute
the Office of a constable in the Hundred and County of
was legally and in due form then and there elected and
appointed to be the constable of the said Hundred of
which said Election and Appointment the same
Thomas afterwards to wit the said day and year
last mentioned at the place also had notice and the
Oath of a constable of the Hundred and in due form
of Law did take and the said Thomas was and
continued constable of the said Hundred from
the said third Tuesday of November in the year of
