of our Lord Dominions Anne Dom One thousand
Seven Hundred thirty and four to the Sheriff of
Kent County that he shall take James Winggold
Son of Wm Winggold of Langford Bay Dover
Hundred in the County and present if he shall be
found in his Bailiwick and him safe keep so that
he have his body before our Justices of said County
Court to be held at our Court house in the town
of Newington in said County of the third Tuesday
in November instant to answer unto a certain
Information for not repairing in person to the
dwelling house of a certain Thomas Alfrey of the
said Hundred and County plaintiff and there
require a true list under his hand of all his taxable
persons distinctly to be made which he had in his
family but so to do altogether did neglect against
the form of the Acts of Assembly in such case made
And that the Sheriff of Kent County have at the
time & place of the said Writ &c
