And now here to wit at Kent County aforesaid at the Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday of June being the twenty first day of said month in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred thirty seven cometh herinto Court John Gambell in his proper person and prayeth that his Recognizance taken as aforesaid might be discharged

Ordered by this Court here that John Gambell & Francis Reed his Surety be discharged as prayed

John Gambell & Francis Reed their Recognizance taken as aforesaid by this Court here discharged their being no cause Shown to the contrary &c

At what said day & year last mentioned cometh John Flood herinto Court in his proper person & prayeth that his recognizance taken as aforesaid may be discharged

Ordered by this Court here that the aforesaid John Flood his Recognizance taken as aforesaid be discharged as prayed

At what said day & year aforesaid last above mentioned cometh William Graves herinto Court in his proper person and prayeth that his Recognizance taken as aforesaid may be discharged
