certain hours before or after a performance, or during a special fund raiser for the Center; requiring the licensee to abide by all rules and pay a certain annual fee; requiring certain officers of the Center to sign the application, with a certain number of signors to be from Frederick County; clarifying language; generally relating to alocholic beverages in Frederick County; and making this Act an emergency measure.
